Welcome to 7th Grade Science! This course is designed to help students gain a better understanding of the world around them. Students will learn about the scientific method, electric and magnetic forces, gravity, and Newton's Laws. They will also explore changes within Earth, plate tectonics weather and climate. Students will focus on understanding phenomena through cause and effect, stability and change, and energy and matter. Course Expectations and Rules

Class Requirements

For this class, you will be required to have the following items each day:

Lab Activities

Students will be involved in lab activities. These activities may involve specialized equipment and/or chemicals. It will be important for students to follow directions during these activities. Because there are

safety issues involved with lab activities, if students do not follow directions or do not maintain professional behavior during lab activities, then they will not be allowed to interact with the lab and will only be allowed to watch and take notes.

Make-up and Late Work

Labs, projects, and assignments are due at the end of class on the date assigned unless it is a multi-day in-class assignment.

Late work will not be accepted unless it is late due to an excused absence. If a student is absent, it is his/her responsibility to make up all the work missed during the absence.

- A student has two days for each excused absence to complete missed assignment, but it shall not exceed more than one week without administrator approval.
 - For example, if a student was absent Monday and comes back Tuesday, the work is not due until Wednesday of the same week.
- If a test is missed while a student is absent, the student will make up the test during tutoring time on the day he/she returns. A missed quiz will be made up at the teacher's discretion.
- A student who has an unexcused absence will receive a zero on class work.

Mandatory Tutoring

Students will be placed in academic probation if his/her grade falls to an "F". Students will have to attend mandatory tutoring when his/her grade falls below a "C". Mandatory tutoring is every Monday and Wednesday from 2:50-3:30pm. Please refer to the student handbook for additional information.

Students who fail a semester core course are required to attend Academic Friday School from 12:15 pm-3:30 pm the following semester to make up the credit. Students who fail to attend Academic Friday School are subject to disciplinary action.

*Once enrolled, North Pointe does not accept course credit from other high school or online institutions.

Electronic Devices

Cell phones, iPods, MP3 players, and other electronic devices and their accessories (ear buds, headphones, chargers, etc.) may not be visible or used during class without administrative approval. In addition, all non-class-related items must be removed from the desk and may not be touched, used, or referred to during class.
